

Kam Day Canoe Races Today On Ala Wai

Hawaii's ancient sport of kings, canoe paddling races, will be revived on the Ala Wai canal today with the staging of the Kamehameha Day regatta by the Kamaaina Beachcombers Hui. Eleven races, including surfboard paddling, are on the program.

The first race will start at 9:30 a.m. All junior races will start on the ewa end of the canal near the McCully street bridge, while the senior events will start at the Diamond Head end of the canal.

Owen 'Restrained'

ST. LOUIS, June 10 (UP)—Mickey Owen, once the darling of Flatbush, was cited as one of the Brooklyn Dodgers' most feared enemies today when that National League club obtained a temporary restraining order against its former catcher who now manages the Vera Cruz team in the Mexican Baseball League.

Federal Judge Richard M. Duncan signed the order late Saturday but it was kept a secret in the hopes that the five defendants could be located here and served with summons. The injunction, the second the Dodgers have obtained against the Mexican circuit, named Jorge Pasquel, league president; two of his brothers, Alfonso and Bernardo, and Mario Loussac, an alleged agent, in addition to Owen.

The Kona senior crews will be augmented by Tony Morse and Ernest Moses, who hail from the Big Island. Morse will stroke the senior six and the senior two, with Abraham Moses the steersman on all three senior crews.

Kona is also entering the three junior races, with George Stepp the steersman. Joe Kanuha will be stroke on the senior six and Henry Kaholi will stroke the senior four and two.
