

# OCC Takes Senior, Junior Six Paddles

Outrigger Canoe club and Hui Nalu, picking up where they left off in the 1938 outrigger canoe paddling regatta, dominated the Kamaaina Beachcombers Hui's Kamehameha Day races on the Ala Wai canal yesterday.

A crowd estimated at 3,000 lined the Ala Wai canal to watch the revival of outrigger canoe paddling races.

The Outrigger paddlers swept the major events, capturing the blue ribbon in the senior and junior 6-paddle mile races and the two 4-paddle mile events.

Hui Nalu won the two half mile women's events, the men's senior and junior 2-paddle half mile races and the half mile 6-paddle for boys under 17.

Outrigger and Hui Nalu each scored two seconds. The Outrigger did not enter any team in the women's races.

Using their slick, freshly painted "Leilani," the OCC crews were steered by "Turkey" Love in the senior races and T. Kiakona in the junior events.

Natatorium and Kona also entered crews in the men's events but couldn't quite measure up to the OCC and Hui Nalu entries. Natatorium grabbed three seconds, while the best the Kona crews could do was to take three third places.

Both the senior and junior 6-paddle events developed into thrilling races between Outrigger and Hui Nalu. Outrigger, with Love steering and Tom Arnott, J. Pluger, Carlos Rivas, Aaron Chaney and F. Ferni pulling together strongly and evenly, held the lead from the start and finished a length ahead in 7 min. 45 seconds. Hui Nalu pulled ahead in the senior event.

Hui Nalu, however, challenged all the way and finished a strong second in 7:50.5, two lengths ahead of Natatorium, with Kona coming in last.

The pattern of the race was the same in the 6-paddle junior event, with Hui Nalu challenging strongly but lacking the final drive to catch Outrigger. The OCC crew of William Ireton, paddling No. 1, Aaron Chaney, Buzz Moriarity, Elwood Van Gieson, P. Caricoff and Kiakona, won by 1 1/2 lengths in 8:45.9, followed by Hui Nalu in 8:54.2 and Natatorium, a close third, in 8:56.3. Natatorium held second place until the half mile mark when Hui Nalu pulled ahead.

Edgar Smith of the White Sox outpitched Russ Christopher at Philadelphia to win a 1 to 0 duel in which he was helped greatly by a triple play in the first inning. Irv Hall lined to second baseman Don Kolloway, who threw to shortstop Luke Appling to double base runner Elmer Valo, who had gotten on with a two-bagger. A quick relay to first baseman Hal Trosky nipped Barney McCoskey, who had walked. Smith, giving up six hits, got his winning margin in the seventh when Appling doubled, went to third on a fly and scored on Whitey Platt's single.

The Browns won their fourth straight game without a loss to the Senators this year, batting them 6 to 2 in a night game at Washington on a four-run rally in the eighth. Five straight hits, capped by Walt Judnich's two-run double did the damage. Judnich also got a homer as Newman (Tex) Shirley won his fourth game, an eight-hitter.

The Cardinals, trailing 3 to 0, opened up with four runs in the fifth and went on to beat the visiting Dodgers, 9 to 3, reducing their first place margin in the National to one game. It was the fourth straight Cardinal victory over the Dodgers without a defeat this year. Lefty Alpha Brazle, who relieved starter Ken Burkhardt, gained the victory. Pete Reiser and Chuck Stevens accounted for all the Dodger runs with homers.

The Pirates cashed in on Boston misplays and a three-run triple by Hank Camelli to beat the Braves at Pittsburgh, 5 to 3, though outhit 11 to 6. Rip Sewell went all the way to win his fourth victory.

Johnny Vandermeer, given a two-run lead in the first inning, pitched the Reds to a 3 to 2 victory over the Giants at Cincinnati. Al Libke hit a Cincinnati homer.
