Jim Weaver of the Navy took a convincing nod over Walter Andrade of Schofield in a middleweight tangle while Andy Piscesa, also of the Navy, won over Nobuo Yoshida of Village AC in a fast bantam go.

One of the evening's top slug-fests came in the Cleghorn McKee—Robert Adams welter-weight fracas. They poured hot leather at each other for three full rounds with the Cokes battler finishing stronger to take the win over Adams, of the Navy.

Jiro Mitsuyasa of Village AC laid out Henry Ventura of St. Patrick's in the second round while Eddie Cowell of CYO chilled Joe Contrades of the Cokes in the third. Larry Medina of Wahiawa won on a TKO when Charles King of the Navy failed to answer the bell for the third.
