2 New Events For Kam Day Are Scheduled

Two new events scheduled for this year's Kamehameha Day celebration are a parade of canoes off Waikiki from Queen's Surf to the Outrigger Canoe club and a torch light relay, it was announced Wednesday by Charles W. Kenn, Kamehameha Day Celebration commission member.

Mr. Kenn, said the canoe parade is listed as a water pageant and the canoes will carry the queen of the Kam Day ceremonies and the princesses representing the eight islands of the Hawaiian

group.

THE QUEEN and her retinue, upon completion of the pageant, are to appear at dancing programs at the Royal Hawaiian hotel and at the Queen's Surf.

The event, which will climax the celebration activities on the night of June 11, is to be sponsored by the Hawaiian Hotels as-

sociation.

THE TORCH LIGHT relay, while sponsored by the City-wide association, will be held in conjunction with the commemoration of King Kamehameha's birthday anniversary and will take place at 7:30 p. m. on June 9.

Two teams of City-Wide and one

from the Catholic Youth organization are entered in the relay which will begin at King and Middle streets in Kalihi and end at the King St. entrance of Iolani

Palace.

MR. KENN ALSO announced that the route of the traditional Kam Day parade of floats and pa-u riders has been changed. Instead of beginning from Aala park, the parade will start from Kaahumanu school on Beretania St., proceed ewa on Beretania to Bishop St., move makai on Bishop, turn left on King, circle the statue of Kamehameha and then enter the palace grounds.
