

Outrigger Senior Six Triumphs

2,000 Spectators See Annual Regatta At Beach

Hui Nalu dominated the annual Kamehameha Day canoe regatta yesterday afternoon at Waikiki Beach, winning seven out of ten races. Coached by John D. Kaupiko, Sr., the Hui Nalus displayed great form and sliced through the waters in brilliant fashion. Approximately 2,000 spectators watched the races from the beach in front of the Outrigger Canoe Club and the Royal Hawaiian Hotel.

Although beaten in a majority of the races, the Outrigger Club came through with flying colors in the blue ribbon event—the Senior Six, winning by virtually four boat lengths over a course of approximately two miles. The time was 10 minutes 6 seconds.

Outrigger took an early lead as the race started in front of the Tavern. At the first turn at Grays Beach, Outrigger set the pace by about three lengths.

On the beat back to the Tavern, the Hui Nalus offered a strong challenge, but the OCC paddlers were equal to their task and retained the advantage. Making the final turn and racing back to the finish line in front of the Royal Hawaiian Hotel, the Outriggers won by four boat lengths.

Members of the winning crew were T. Arnot, Denhart, Beaumont, Pflueger, Tobin, and Allen Love. The second place Hui Nalu crew was steered by Kekai.

A second Hui Nalu entry, steered by Buddy Young, encountered tough luck. At the outset of the race, it was swamped by a huge wave and then as it neared the first turn, the outriggers snapped, forcing it out of the competition.

Outrigger also won the feature race for women paddlers, Girls Senior Six.

The crew consisted of Pat Honi, Yvonne Boyd, Pam Anderson, Ivanelle Mountcastle, Doris Berg, and Duke Kahanamoku, steering.

The race was over a course of approximately one mile, starting off Grays Beach proceeding to the Tavern and finishing off at the Royal Hawaiian Hotel.

The time was six minutes 18.8 seconds.

First honors in the Senior Men's Four Paddle race went to Turkey Love's Outrigger crew, with Duke Kahanamoku's Outrigger No. 2 quartet finishing a close second. Hui Nalu was third and the time for the one mile event was 3 minutes 45.5 seconds.

Hui Nalu won a close race in the Junior Four Paddle event, beating the Outrigger crew, steered by Duke Kahanamoku by one boat length. Another Outrigger crew, with Love steering was third.

Members of the winning crew were D. Kaaihue, M. Kamalopili, E. Burke, and R. Kekai.

The Junior six for men, raced over the same course as the senior six, resulted in a victory for the Hui Nalus by five boat lengths over Outrigger. Hui Nalu's time was 9 minutes 56 seconds. A crew representing McCabe, Hamilton, Renny Co., was third.

The Junior Girls Six Paddle race went to the Hui Nalu club over the Hawaiian Civic Club entry. It was a close race over one mile and the winning time was 7 minutes 3 seconds. The Outrigger crew was disqualified.

In the canoe race for men over 40, Hui Nalu with Joe Akana steering, emerged victorious over Outrigger. It was over half a mile and the time was 3 minutes 42 seconds.

Hui Nalu also won the race for boys under 12, with Outrigger second.

In the freshmen race, which was the closest of the day, over approximately two miles, the Hui Nalu crew, steered by Bob Kekai, was victorious. It was the closest of the day, with Hui Nalu No. 2 crew, steered by Blues Makua, pressing the winners most of the way.

The winners did not start pulling away from the field until the final turn. Outrigger was third.

Hui Nalu won the race for boys under 16 years of age over Outrigger, registering 3 minutes 43 seconds, for approximately half a mile.

In a special surfboard race, George Downing won easily with Paul Villiers and Wally Forsythe finishing second and third respectively. The time for the mile course was 4 minutes 48.3 seconds.

Prior to the races, hula and music featured a short pageanty.

Flying Cloud Big Yacht

"Flying Cloud," Jay Quealy's 60-foot yawl, won the Kamehameha Day regatta yesterday afternoon, trailing after the first downwind beat from Barber's Point to the line with a twelve minute lead over the schooner "Manuiwa," second boat to finish.

Third spot went to Navy's 60-foot yawl "Thelma," skippered by Captain J. A. Holbrook, with Alan Chase's undercanvassed 67-foot schooner "Martha" last in the 60-foot class. An impromptu race between E. R. Simmerer's 43-foot schooner "Kitone" and Hayden Phillips 48-foot ketch "Cynjo" ended with "Kitone" ahead.

"Manuiwa" took the lead at the 10:00 a.m. start, followed by the "Cloud," "Martha," and "Thelma." Within a half hour the two leading boats had drawn far ahead of the two trailers, with both the Quealy and Dillingham yachts changing position frequently during the first leg of the course. "Manuiwa" held a six second lead at the Barber's Point buoy marker, but was overtaken in scant minutes after the "Cloud" turned inside "Manuiwa" at the buoy.

Tacking upwind to Diamond Head the "Cloud" steadily widened its margin, turning the windward marker fifteen minutes ahead of "Manuiwa." The latter picked up nearly three minutes on the short reach to Kewalo.

"Thelma," after a bad start, broke out a spinnaker for the first leg of the course and was third at Barber's Point. Both the Navy boat and "Martha" dropped steadily back during the beat to Diamond Head.

Quealy's win gives him permanent possession of the 60-foot class trophy, a silver pitcher donated by Dr. Paul Withington. The race was held under the auspices of the Pearl Harbor Yacht Club, with PHYC race committee chairman Art Waal Jr. supervising.
