Chase took two long runs out to sea and hitched shoreward to triumph. His first run out to sea was made off Diamond Head. Moving in shoreward at Moanalu Bay, Chase moved toward the horizon again off Koko Head and hitched shoreward again off Makapuu and sailed into Kaneohe Bay the winner.
