11 EVENTS ON BIG PROGRAM; 4 TEAMS SET

Eleven events constitute the annual Walter Macfarlane Memorial canoe races to be held Monday at 10 a.m. off the Outrigger Canoe club at Waikiki beach.

Entries include the Hui Nalu, coached by John D. Kaupiko; Honolulu police department, coached by Herbert Oliviera, Max Kamaiopili and Blue Makua.

Outrigger Canoe club, coached by "Toots" Minvielle and Duke Kahanamoku, and McCabe, Hamilton and Renny, coached by Charles A. Guard and Joe Akana.

The Walter Macfarlane Memorial canoe races are held annually on July 4 in memory of a past president of the club and one of its most beloved members.

Walter "Mac," as he was familiarly called, was president of the club in 1939. Through keenness of foresight and with an indomitable will, Walter built a new club which today stands as a fitting memorial to the achievement of a successful young man.

Mac succeeded in selling bonds and raised the capital to erect the present club at Waikiki beach.

Mr. Macfarlane passed away on June 4, 1943, in Oakland, Calif.

A bronze plaque has been placed in the foyer of the club in his memory and it is most fitting that the memorial races are held in memoriam to him each year.

 - 2—JUNIOR GIRLS, 6-1 turn around inside flag.
 - 3—SENIOR MEN, 4-1 turn around outside flag.
 - 4—KIDS, 6-1 turn around outside flag.
 - 5—JUNIOR MEN, 4-1 turn around outside flag.
 - 6—SENIOR GIRLS, 6-1 turn around inside flag.
 - 7—BOYS 14 AND UNDER—from Waikiki tavern to finish line.
 - 8—SENIOR MEN, 6-3 times around outside flag.
 - 9—FRESHMEN MEN, 6-1 turn around outside flag.
 - 10—MEN OVER 40—1 turn around inside flag.
 - 11—RELAY (2 CANOES)—1 turn around inside flag (each canoe.)

Presentation of prizes will be made by Wilford D. Godbold, president of the Outrigger Canoe club at 3 p.m.
