

Glassbox Service Opens Mysteries Of Ocean Depths

Visitors at Waikiki will be given a new treat in water sports when the Outrigger Beach Services inaugurates its "glassbox sightseeing" service.

Louis R. (Sally) Hale, director of beach services for the Outrigger, announced today that eight glassboxes are being completed for this sport.

This new sport is designed for "quiet" days when the surf is not adequate for surfboard riding or outrigger canoeing.

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VISITORS ARE oared out to shallow fishing grounds and through the glassboxes can see the colorful marine life abounding in Hawaiian waters. If he sees a fish he wants for dinner that night, he can designate it to one of the Waikiki Surfers who will dive and spear the fish for him.

The organized activity of the Outrigger Beach Services was resumed last year to serve the renewed tourist trade.

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THE SURFERS, who are expert in various typical Island sports such as surfing, canoeing, swimming, were handpicked by Mr. Hale for this work.

In addition to helping visitors and residents enjoying surfboard riding and outrigger canoeing, the organization also provides men skilled in the art of lomi-lomi and swimming instructions.
