Gay Harris Quits Outrigger Club

The resignation of Gay Harris as manager of the Outrigger Canoe club was announced today by Wil-

ford D. Godbold, president.

Mr. Godbold, who is city-county attorney, said the Waikiki beach club's board of directors had accepted the resignation as of Monday.

It was reliably reported that Mr. Harris, a member of a widely known, kamaaina family, had resigned in order to enter a new business.

Mr. Harris became manager of the club in August, 1945. He was one of Hawaii's outstanding backstroke swimmers in the '20s. The club's managerial functions,

meanwhile, have been temporarily assumed by the finance committee,

Mr. Godbold said.

A special committee has been appointed, Mr. Godbold added, to seek a qualified successor to manage the

club.

This committee includes Thomas A. Gage, assistant manager, Alexander Young hotel; Samuel M. Fuller, territorial tax assessor, and Leslie A. Hicks, president, Hawaiian Electric Co., Ltd.

Mr. Harris was not available today for comment on his future busi-

ness plans.
