Canoe Club Formed At Waikiki 40 Years Ago

The Outrigger Canoe Club will celebrate its 40th birthday today with a May Day honoring its kamaaina members.

Today the club has 1,850 members and maintains a \$100,000 clubhouse on the beach at Waikiki. The club started with 102 charter members in 1908 and housed its canoes and surfboards under a grass shack located on the same site.

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Organization of the club was promoted by the late Alexander Hume Ford and a small group of other local residents who were interested in reviving interest in the sport of surfboarding and canoeing at Waikiki.

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Charles R. Frazier, Sr., a charter member of the club, recently presented to the club the original list of charter members and a letter signed by those who promoted the organization.
