## **Nalus Win Macfarlane** Memorial Canoe Races

In the blue ribbon event of the afternoon, 4½ mile race, senior men, the Outrigger Canoe club maintained its winning streak of six in as many years by negotiat-ing the distance in 34 minutes 10.1 seconds.

# Hui Nalu's "Malolo" led until the end of the first lap, but was swamped at this point to be over-hauled by the OCC's "Leilani," which led by a comfortable margin the remainder of the distance.

Waikiki Surf club's "Hanakeoki" hit the finish line before "Malolo," but was relegated to third spot owing to disqualification. Members the winning crew were Tommy of O'Brien, Bob Bush, Don Tobin, Jim Pflueger, Ken Chaney and Allan (Turkey) Love.

Outrigger Canoe club's "Kakina" came in second in the four man junior men's one turn race, but was scratched by the judges for bump-ing into Hui Nalu's entry on the outside turn.

Honolulu police department's "Leilani" was occorded second place. Hui Nalu's "Malolo" was first, the time being 8 minutes 3.4 seconds.

In the final event of the afternoon, the two canoe relay race, which proved to be most exciting. the Hui Nalu crew, some 15 lengths behind the Outrigger team, out-paddled its rivals on the final turn and crossed the finish line several lengths ahead.

In a special "mint tulip" event for the visiting midshipmen, the Princeton crew hit the finish line first with a sudden, unexpected capsizing. Dartmouth Indians and the Yale Bulldogs finished second and third, respectively. =
