

Kamehameha Day Aquatic Program Set

Kamehameha Day aquatic sports get under way at 1 p. m. Saturday at Waikiki beach off the Outrigger Canoe club.

Canoe and surfboard races, hoo-kupu and a dinner-holoku ball will constitute the program for the day.

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Featured on the day's program are the water polo contest between Coach Sargent Kahanamoku's Outrigger Canoe and the Waikiki Surf clubs and the men's open canoe race.

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The 1948 Kamehameha Day feature event, the two mile senior canoe race, saw the OCC sextet of O'Brien, Dowsett, Bush, Pflueger, Chaney and Duke Kahanamoku cop first place.

Hui Nalu was second and McCabe club third.

The water sports Saturday afternoon will be preceded by the hoo-kupu, the ancient Hawaiian custom of gift-giving by the subjects to their chiefs.

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A holoku ball and dinner at 6:30 p. m. at the Outrigger will bring the day's activities to a close.
