Events For Koolaupoko Regatta Set

Five canoe paddling and six surfboard races, as well as several special events, will be presented at the first annual Koolaupoko Regatta Day at Kailua Beach on Labor Day, Sept. 5, it was announced last night by Val Marciel and Pat Olds of the Koolaupoko Lions' Club committee in charge of the program.

The two Koolaupoko Club committeemen met with representa-tives of Waikiki beach clubs yesterday to work out a program for the regatta. At the meeting were John Kaupiko, Joe Pang, Buster Shim and Ah Kong Pang of Hui Nalu, John Lind and Wally Froi-seth of Walkiki Surf Club and William Morris, William Barnhart and Jim Dowsett of Outrigger Cande Club.

"The four clubs will have some 200 representatives par-ticipating in the regatta," said Marciel. "We expect to move Waikiki to Kailua for that day," he kidded.

The water sports begin at 10 a. m, and will include men's senior six, men's junior six, freshmen six, kids' six and women's open in canoe paddling. Surfboard races are senior and junior open, one mile; redwood plank, women open, kids open and tandem, 100 yards. Special events are races between Lions' Club crews and seniors (50 and over). Aquaplaning and possibly a hukilau are also planned. The public is invited and the program is free.

Before the water sports, the youth committee will hold bicycle races in three divisions, starting at 8:30. The races are junior, six miles, from NAS gate to Kailua park; intermediate, three miles: midgets, 1½ miles from Kailua Drug to park. All races will go through the business district and

finish at Kailua park
