

Koolaupoko Lions Pleased; Plan Bigger '50 Regatta

KAILUA, Oahu, Sept. 6—An overflow crowd of more than 5,000 holiday minded Oahuans jammed the shores of beautiful Kailua bay to witness the first annual Labor Day regatta sponsored by the Koolaupoko Lions club.

Meeting with such an overwhelming success, officials of the local Lions have already announced an even bigger and better regatta for next year.

Said Val Marciel, spirited chairman of the regatta committee, "We are more than gratified by the interest shown by the people of Oahu, and next year we plan to put on a show that will far excel this year's."

Beginning with the bicycle races which got under way at 8:30 a.m., the day's program included a huki-lau, music by the Royal Hawaiian band, Andy Cummings and his Koolaupoko Srenaders, Bella Richards and her troupe and the regatta.

Ruling in a state of majestic sweetness over the day's activities were lovely Marlene Mladinich and her two sisters, Lona and Adrienne.

With a view to reviving ancient Hawaiian sports, the windward Oahu Lions conducted an 11 event program.

The Waikiki Surf club won the team honors with 54 points. Outrigger Canoe club was next with 22; and Hui Nalu third with 17.

Cooperating with the Lions were 23 public spirited windward Oahu stores and firms who made possi-

ble trophies and other prizes for winners in the bicycle and regatta events.

Event No. 7, senior six canoe paddle, one mile open, which was the blue ribbon event of the day, was won by Waikiki Surf club crew of George Downing, Edward Whaley, R. Choy, P. Kaaihue, Russ Takaki and Wally Froiseth.

Hui Nalu was second and Outrigger Canoe third. A "tight" race all the way, each boat was only one third of a boat length of each other at the finish line.
