gaged as architect, has drawn up detailed plans and specifications which were accepted by the build-

ing supervisory committee and the board of directors of the club. Bids were received from E. Fitz-

simmons, James Glover, James Clark, Nordic Construction Co., Hawaiian Dredging Co., Pacific Construction Co., and C. W. Win-

stedt.

Bids were opened on September 9 and at a meeting held on September 14 the board of directors directed that the contract be given

to James Clark. His bid was most favorable, to-taling \$39,300 and offering to com-

plete the job in 115 days. This construction cost with furnishings and other items will cover a total investment of approximate-ly \$50,000.

The Outrigger Canoe club has been in its present home for some 10 years with practically no major changes.

Plans will provide for enlarge-ment of the sun deck offering bet-ter facilities for small parties and a game room, extensive changes
