PORTLAND, Ore. — The ILWU members recently fined for rioting and attack at The Dalles, Ore., paid \$6,200 in fines—but they did not pay it out of their own pockets.

It was paid for them by their union, after they had been tried and found guilty of rioting in connection with the incident of the Hawaiian Pineapple Co. barge and attacks by ILWU members at The Dalles.

It is reported here that the union allowed each ILWU member \$15 per day during the time they were in jail.
