U.S. Stars Win Races In Finland

SEINAJOKI, Finland, July 7 (UP)—Charley Peters of Indiana, Fortune Gordien of the San Francisco Olympic Club and Bob Richards of the Illinois A. C. each won two events today in an international track and field meet against Finnish athletes.

Peters won the 100-meter sprint in :10.8 and the 200-meter dash in :22.2. Gordien took the discus event with a throw of 51.56 meters (about 169 feet, two inches) and the shot put with a heave of 15.41 meters (about 50 feet, 6½ inches. Richards high
