

Koolaupoko Lions To Sponsor Regatta

The Koolaupoko Lions will sponsor the second annual canoe regatta on Labor Day, Sept. 4, at Kailua, it was announced last night.

The races will be held in front of the Kailua park and will climax a day of sports activities. While the regatta will start at 1:30 in the afternoon, festivities for the day will get under way at 9:30 a.m.

Five clubs will definitely enter the regatta. They are the Hui Nalu, Waikiki Surf Club, Healani, Outrigger Canoe Club, and the Canoe Club of the Koolaupoko Lions.

The Koolaupoko Lions will enter the canoe races for the first time. The Lions have steamed up considerable interest in the aquafest in the Koolaupoko area and fifty-four candidates have been turning out regularly for places in the various crews.

Besides canoe racing, there will be surfboard competition, according to plans set yesterday.

Starting at 9:30 a.m., the Koolaupoko Lions plan to have a series of bicycle races for youngsters. At 10 until 11 a.m. there will be a band concert by the Royal Hawaiian band and all the while, a hukilau will be taking place on the beach.

Between 11:30 and 12:30, there will be surfboard racing.

Following an hour of entertainment from 12:30 to 1:30, the canoe races will be held. There will be eight events.

The Koolaupoko Lions' regatta committee is optimistic that the events will be held before a large crowd. The program was a huge success last year from the standpoint of competition and spectator interest.
