Kahanamoku Day Program Announced

Duke Kahanamoku, one of the greatest swimmers to win an Olympic championship, will be honored by the Outrigger Canoe club Saturday, Aug. 26, when the beach organization observes "Duke Kahanamoku Day" in celebrating his 60th birthday. Duke will be 60 on August 24.

Bob Fischer, program director, announced that canoe and surfboard racing, swimming, sailing and volleyball are among the events scheduled for Saturday. The day's activities will be followed by a steak fry from 7:00 to 9 p. m. and special entertainment and birthday greeting to Duke Kahanamoku from 9 p. m. to 1 a. m.

12:00 to 2 p. m.—Sailing race (Waikiki Yacht club).

2:00 to 2:30—Small Catamaran race.

3:00 to 5:00 — Open house, canoe surf riding.

7:00 to 9:00—Steak fry.

9:00 to 1 a.m.—Dancing, entertainment and special birthday greeting to Duke Kahanamoku.

Swimming races will include 100 yards for girls, 100 yards for junior boys, 100 yards for boys 15 and under, 100 yards for senior men and 25 yards for oldtimers.

Surfboard races will be held for girls and boys and for senior men from Waikiki Tavern to Outrigger Canoe club and 100 yards for oldtimers.

Canoe races from beach to canoe surf and return will be senior men six, junior men six, freshmen six, kid's six, wahine senior six and wahine junior six. A special race

for oldtimers will be held over 100 yards.
