

# Koolaupoko Club Regatta Program Set

Program for the Koolaupoko Lions club regatta at Kailua on Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 4, was announced yesterday. Feature of the day is the canoe paddling races scheduled to begin at 1:30 p.m. off Kailua beach.

There will be eight events in the canoe paddling regatta, with the Outrigger, Hui Nalu, Healani, Waikiki Surf and Koolaupoko Canoe club entered.

The lanes for the canoe regatta follow:

1. Kids' Six, under 17, half mile—Outrigger 1, Hui Nalu 2, Healani 3, Waikiki Surf 4, Koolaupoko 5.

2. Men's Freshman Six, half mile—Koolaupoko 1, Outrigger 2, Hui Nalu 3, Healani 4, Waikiki Surf 5.

3. Wahine Junior Six, Half mile—Waikiki Surf 1, Koolaupoko 2, Outrigger 3, Hui Nalu 4, Healani 5.

4. Special men over 40, quarter mile—Lanes to be drawn.

5. Men's Senior Six, one mile—Healani 1, Waikiki Surf 2, Koolaupoko 3, Outrigger 4, Hui Nalu 5.

6. Special boys' six, under 15, quarter mile—Lanes to be drawn.

7. Men's Junior Six, one mile—Hui Nalu 1, Healani 2, Waikiki Surf 3, Koolaupoko 4, Outrigger 5.

8. Wahine Senior Six, half mile—Outrigger 1, Hui Nalu 2, Healani 3, Waikiki Surf 4, Koolaupoko 5.

There will be surfboard paddle races from 11:30 to 12:30, with the following events scheduled:

Men's junior, half mile; women's open, 100 yards; redwood plank, 11 foot, 100 yards; kid's open, boys under 16, 100 yards; men's senior open, half mile; surfboard sail race.

The annual youth committee bicycle race at 9:30 a.m. opens the day's events. Races will be for juniors of ages 14 to 16, starting at Koolau Boys' Home; intermediates, ages 11 to 13, starting at Waimanalo-Kailua junction, and midgets, ages up to 10, starting at Kailua Drug store. The finish line for all races is at Lanikai store.

There will be entertainment from 10 to 11:30 a.m. The flotilla arrives with Duke Kahanamoku, marshal of the day, Queen Victoria Bright and her attendants, at 11 a.m. Merrill K. Riley, Lions' district governor, District 50, will give the address of welcome.

There will be no admission to the regatta and the public is invited to attend. To offset expenses, the Koolaupoko Lions club will have booths scattered on the grounds offering Hawaiian, American and Japanese foods. Profits will be used to help defray the club's expenses.
