The boat—Papaloa (means "long board")—is 42 feet in length and President Clem Paiaina says "she's a beauty."

The log from which the canoe was built comes from Greenwell's Ranch at Kelakekua, South Kona, on the Big Island. It is a gift of Amy Greenwell.

Builder of the craft is Charles Mokuohai Sr. of Kona, who describes Papaloa as the best and longest of the three he has built.

Mrs. Mary McKeague, whose husband John is an oldtime member of the Healanis, will christine the boat.
