

11 Event Canoe Racing Program in Keehi Sunday

There'll be canoe racing in Keehi Lagoon Sunday starting at 11 a. m.

The 11 event Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association sponsored program is the third and final qualifying series of races for the big Julian Yates Championship Regatta scheduled August 9 in Kona, Hawaii.

Approximately 114 paddlers, representing six Oahu clubs, will make the Kona trip next month.

Blue ribbon event Sunday is the senior men three mile race. This should work out into a thriller with Coach Wally Forsythe's Waikiki Surf Club crew rated a slight favorite.

Expected to press Waikiki all the way to the finish line are Coach D. Kaupiko's Hui Nalu and Coach George (Dad) Center's Outrigger crews.

The Waikikians also get the nod of experts for the women's top event of the day—the one mile senior race.
