

Outrigger Annexes Qualifying Regatta

Waikiki Surf Club Second But Triumphs In Men's Senior Six; Hui Nalu Takes Third In Series, Second in Final Regatta

Oahu crews which will compete in the Julian Yates canoe paddling championships at Kona, Hawaii, Aug. 9, were determined yesterday afternoon as the third and final qualifying regatta was held in Keehi lagoon.

A total of 114 paddlers, representing Outrigger Canoe Club, Waikiki Surf Club, Hui Nalu, Koolau-poko Canoe Club and Healanl, will be selected for the men's senior and junior six, men's senior and junior four, men's freshmen six and women's senior and junior six.

Outrigger and Waikiki Surf will have crews in each of the seven events. Hui Nalu will have five crews, while Koolau-poko and Healanl each qualified one.

The qualifying crews were those which had the highest total of points for three regattas—on Maritime Day, June 11, and yesterday. Outrigger won the three-race series with 79 points, followed by Waikiki Surf with 47, Hui Nalu with 41, Koolau-poko with 14, Healanl with 13 and Hui Kalia with 11.

- Senior Four Men — Waikiki Surf (9), Outrigger (9), Hui Nalu (5).
- Junior Four Men — Outrigger (10), Waikiki Surf (7), Koolau-poko (6).
- Senior Six Women—Outrigger (13), Waikiki Surf (6), Healanl (2).
- Junior Six Women—Outrigger (13), Hui Nalu (11), Waikiki Surf (2).

The Outrigger Canoe Club also won yesterday's regatta with 32 points, winning five races, taking two seconds and finishing third once. Hui Nalu was second with 19, followed by Waikiki Surf with 15, Koolau-poko with three, Hui Kalia with two and Healanl one.

Waikiki Surf copped only one blue ribbon, the feature men's senior six, while Hui Nalu won the men's senior four and the boys 17 and under event. Outrigger captured the blue ribbon in the freshmen six, boys novice six, junior six for women, junior four for men and senior six for women.

The final event, the senior men's four, resulted in the closest finish, Hui Nalu winning in 9:08 and the other two boats finishing within three seconds of each other, Waikiki Surf in 9:10 and Outrigger in 9:11. The race was over one mile.

The senior six for men over three miles was won by Waikiki Surf in 26:32, with Outrigger a close second in 28:31.4 and Hui Kalia right behind in 29:10.9. Hui Nalu was fourth.

There was only one disqualification in the entire program. In the boys' 17 and under mile race, Waikiki Surf was second to Hui Nalu but was disqualified for an infraction of the rules and Outrigger got the runnerup post. Hui Nalu won in 9:45.
