

WSC Captures MacFarlane Regatta

The annual Walter J. MacFarlane Memorial Canoe Regatta, using a new course at Waikiki Beach yesterday, was won by the powerful Waikiki Surf Club. Staged under the auspices of the Outrigger Canoe Club, the regatta was sponsored by the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association.

The crowd, estimated to be the largest to witness this yearly program, enjoyed a 5-hour, 13-event affair. The weather

was ideal—sunshine and light winds—for both paddlers and spectators.

Coach Noa Kalama's Red and Gold paddlers tallied 40 points for top honors. Outrigger Canoe Club shaded Healani, 31-27, for second place while Hui Nalu was fourth with 16 and Kai Oni, the fifth club in competition, scored 12.

Times recorded yesterday established records for the new course.

In the blue ribbon men senior six race, the crack WSC oarsmen won by a comfortable margin, negotiating the six-lap, 3-mile grind in 28:31.4. The victors led all the way, winning by some 250 yards. Kai Oni was second, just a length ahead of Hui Nalu and followed closely by OCC and Healani.

A blanket-finish which brought the crowd to its feet came in the men's junior six, two mile race. Kai Oni nosed out WSC, Healani and Hui Nalu in that order with OCC not far back. The windward club covered the distance in 19:07. Later, officials declared a disqualification against WSC for passing through a wrong lane at the three-quarter mark.

The outstanding individual performance was turned in by Keala Stibbard. She was the steersman on the winning WSC women junior six. Catching a wave on the home stretch and in third place, Stibbard's skill kept the canoe riding the breakers to finish ahead of Healani and OCC. Outrigger was second in point standing as Healani showed only in exhibition.

In another thriller, the WSC women senior six bagged first honors, edging OCC by a half length. Healani and Kai Oni were close third and fourth.

Holomua Paddlers Win Windward Canoe Regatta

The Holomua Canoe Club, coached by Charles Kanei, won five out of seven races and established a new record in one event to win the Windward Oahu Canoe Regatta at Kailua Bay yesterday.

Holomua scored 23 points. Kai Oni and Lanikai registered 17 each.

The Holomua crew for boys 13 and under paddled the quarter-mile distance in 2:01.7 to better the old criterion of 2:09.5.

A crowd of about 3,500 witnessed the races.

The Women's Junior half-mile race was the outstanding event. Lanikai beat Holomua by only two seconds after a neck-and-neck battle all the way. Lanikai's time was 5:52.9

and Holomua's 5:54.9.

The half-mile men's novice race was also a feature. The Holomua crew, composed of Marine and local paddlers, triumphed in 5:23.6.
