

# Poor Surf Restricts Top Makaha Events

The sea at Makaha frolicked with five-foot breakers yesterday, but as far as Joe Maunakea, events chairman of the International Surfing championships, was concerned the waves were not conducive to good surfing.

After waiting from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. for the "10-footers", Maunakea called the meet off and announced that the major part of the program would be held Sunday.

While waiting for the high waves that never came, Maunakea and his efficient staff managed to put on a show which pleased the estimated 10,000 persons who lined the three-quarter mile beach.

At 10:20 a.m. the waves kicked up enough of a fuss for the Women's Senior Surfboard Riding eliminations to be put on. The surfboard debut made a terrific hit with the crowd as statuesque

Vicki Heldreich rode the five-foot waves five times to amass 221 points to lead 12 competitors.

Ethel Kukea, last year's champion, was seeded and did not vie in the trials. She and Miss Heldreich should stage a spirited duel for the honor as the top woman surfer in Hawaii.

Ethel, however, won the Women's Senior Surfboard paddle event over 10 other competitors yesterday.

Tim Guard captured the Junior Men's Surfboard Paddle event for boys 17 years and under then came right back and copped the same race in the men's division. He took the junior race by 15 yards and added insult to injury by winning the men's about 25 yards.

Dr. Dorian Pascowitz of Tel Aviv, Israel led three California surfboard paddlers to victory in the four-man relay. The West Coast paddlers who assisted Dr. Pascowitz were Mongoose Matusic, Dale Cannon and Charles Riemes.

Sunday's program (the waves willing) will include the Men's Senior and Women's Surfboard riding races; Junior Men's Surfboard, Men's Senior and Junior Surfing; Senior Men's Novelty Surfboard and mixed tandem surfboard paddle races.
