

Parking Facilities Are Planned by Outrigger Club

Outrigger Canoe Club committees report that a multi-deck parking structure will be an essential costly item in the development of new facilities at the Elks Club site.

Club planning and prospects were outlined at a general membership meeting November 22, according to Forecast, the club publication.

Construction of all the facilities wanted by the membership would cost \$1 million, it is reported, but the plans may have to be cut back within \$500,000 available.

The building fund is only \$350,000. L. A. Hicks, committee chairman, has reported. Another \$150,000 could be borrowed.

"Obviously some compromise must be made between the funds available and what we would like to spend," he pointed out.

NOT OUT OF LINE

James C. Stopford, reporting on utilization of the Elks Club site, which the Canoe Club is leasing, said that the first-cost and payout of the new facilities "will seem expensive and costly to the membership.

"Assuming that as much as doubling present dues is required, the burden would not be at all out of line."

Stopford, chairman of the long-range master plan committee, recommended that the architect should be given the go-ahead to plan a facility providing the items desired by more than half the club membership replying to questionnaires.
