

Makapuu Surfing Program Sunday

A special three-hour surf program will be presented Sunday at Makapuu, starting at 1 p.m.

Events include body surfing demonstrations, surf life-saving exhibitions, surf mat-riding, open water swimming competitions and body surfing competitions.

The program has been arranged as part of a schedule of surfing activities in honor of "Miss and Mr. Australian Surf."

They are Jan Carmody and Colin MacFarlane, who will visit Hawaii on their trip around the world, a reward for winning a contest sponsored by the Surf and Life Saving Association of Australia.

FOUR-DAY VISIT

Accompanied by their chaperone, Miss June Dally-Watkins, the Aussie surfing stars are scheduled to arrive tomorrow afternoon and to leave Tuesday evening.

The program in their honor has been arranged by a special committee representing the Waikiki Surf Club, the Surf and Life Saving Association of Hawaii, the Outrigger Canoe Club, the Quarterback Club and the Waikiki Lions.

Tomorrow's activities include a gala plane-side Aloha complete with leis, music, hula girls and a welcoming committee, followed by a motorcade to Iolani Palace to meet Governor Quinn.

NO-HOST DINNER

A no-host reception and dinner, starting at 6:30, is scheduled at the Outrigger Canoe Club tomorrow, with surf and swimming enthusiasts invited to meet the visitors.

Following Sunday's special program at Makapuu, the Aussies will be guests of the Quarterback Club at Monday's luncheon meeting at Elliott's Chuck Wagon.

On Tuesday afternoon, they'll be introduced to Waikiki surfing and canoeing at

the Outrigger.

As part of Sunday's program, a special open-water event is being arranged by Dick Cleveland, with local stars competing against MacFarlane.

Tom Zahn, Bill Woolsey, Peter Cole, Ford Konno, in addition to Cleveland, are expected to compete, with the event open to all swimmers.

The distance is about 400 yards, from the beach to the marker and back.
