

Some Beach Boys Impolite, Harbor Board Told

The operators of Waikiki Beach Services complained to Harbor Commissioners yesterday about impolite beach boys at Waikiki Beach.

Mrs. Caroline V. Granelli, co-operator of the beach rental service fronting the Reef Hotel, said beach boys from other concessionaries are being mistaken for those she employs.

With Mrs. Granelli, to help plead her case, was "Splash" Lyons, her partner in Waikiki Beach Services.

Mrs. Granelli specifically asked that commissioners

enforce a rule restricting individual operators to the colors originally agreed to.

She said the Outrigger Canoe Club has been permitting its beach boys to wear yellow shirts, one of Waikiki Beach Services colors, confusing the issue of who works where.

She also complained that some beach boys, down the beach from the Reef, have been impolite to tourists. She said these tourists often complain to her about it.

Mrs. Granelli said, too,

that the Harbor Board ought to do something about enforcing safety rules at Waikiki.

Commission Chairman Tim Ho said something would be done about her complaints by next month's meeting.

OTHER ACTION

Commissioners also:

1—Voted to strengthen rules about providing easement at Waikiki for people to walk on the beach. Some concessionaires are blocking passage on beach public property, it was charged.

6—Asked the co-operation of the Parks Board in providing launching ramps for small boats on Oahu.
