

# Peru Surfing Champs Appear Here July 11

Peru's champion surfers will perform at Waikiki on July 11, it was announced here today.

Neal Ifversen, Peruvian consul here, said that 11 members of the Club Waikiki in Lima will arrive on July 2 and remain for 12 days.

They will participate in a special invitational meet sponsored jointly by the Waikiki Surf Club and the Outrigger Canoe Club, with members of both organizations providing competition for the visitors.

The program is being arranged by George Downing and John McMahon.

The Peruvian surfing aces are also prominent business and civic leaders, Ifversen said, and a comprehensive schedule of social and community events will be arranged in their honor.

Hawaii-Peru surfing relationships have existed for more than a decade, Ifversen said, since a visiting sportsman returned to Lima with a surfboard and initiated the sport at Millaflares Beach.

Since then, Waikiki has

sent several delegations to participate in Peruvian invitational meets, and the South American country has been represented in the International Surfing championships at Makaha.

The coming meet, however, will be the first in which an entire team from Peru will participate at Waikiki, Ifversen said.

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## Pete Newell Considering Husky Post

BERKELEY, Calif., June 13 (AP)—Athletic Director Greg Englehard expressed hopes California basketball coach Pete Newell will reject any University of Washington bids.

He based his hope partially on California's revised athletic policy.
