Waikiki Surf Captures Macfarlane Canoe Races

Waikiki Surf Club edged the Outrigger Canoe Club by one point yesterday to win the annual Walter Macfarlane Memorial canoe regatta off Waikiki beach.

THE WSC paddlers scored 32 points to the sponsoring Outrigger club's 31. Kai Oni was third with 24 points. Healani nipped Lanikai for fourth place, 14 to 13.

WAIKIKI SURF CLUB came from behind to win the regatta, winning the men's senior and both the women's junior and senior races. Victory was clinched by the women's senior six which beat Outrigger in the final race of the day.

Margaret Hipa, Ruby Kalama, Anona Naone, Freida Sheperd, Helen DeFries and Keala Stibbard paddled to a

3:02 victory in the women's senior race.

In the senior men's race over two miles Waikiki Surf also defeated Outrigger in 26 min. 44 sec. The winning boat was made up of Dutchy Kino, Randy Chun, James Koko, Joseph Napoleon, Conrad Cunha and Blue Makua.

Waikiki Surf also won the boys 15 and boys 17 events. Outrigger had first places in the boys 14 and freshmen races. Kai Oni took the boys 13 and women's novice races while Healani copped the men's novice event.

Waves were high in certain lanes and Waikiki Surf swamped once. Kai Oni swamped three times. In the men's senior race Kai Oni swamped but the paddlers

bailed out and finished the race.
