

Outrigger Canoe Race At Catalina Sept. 20

Plans have been finalized for the outrigger canoe race from Catalina Island to Newport Beach, California September 20.

In making the announcement, A. E. (Toots) Mineville, president, Hawaiian-California Canoe Racing Association, said two canoes will be shipped Monday by boat to Newport Beach.

Mineville said the canoes will be used by the California crews, who also may be provided with an instructor from Hawaii.

The 28-mile race was originally planned for September 6.

Mineville said one or more Hawaiian crews will be sent to California in early September.

The race became "official" when Governor Quinn today issued a challenge to Pat Brown, Governor of California.

Mineville said he is leaving soon for a month's vacation on the Mainland and "will work out details of the race."

He also will extend an invitation to the Californians to participate in the annual 35-mile Molokai-Oahu race in October.

Aussies Whip Canada, Gain Semifinals

MONTREAL, July 25 (UPI)—Australia clinched a berth in the North American zone Davis Cup semifinals today when Neale Fraser and Roy Emerson crushed Canada's Bob Bedard and Don Fontana in doubles, 6-3, 6-3, 6-1.

The victory by the Wimbledon doubles champions gave Australia an unbeatable 3-0 lead in the best-of-five match series and reduced Sunday's two final singles matches to meaningless exhibitions.

Australia will meet Cuba in the zone final at Montreal July 31-August 2.
