

Coast Crew Enters Isle Canoe Race

An outrigger team from Newport Harbor, California, will participate in the Molokai-Oahu canoe race October 18.

A. E. (Toots) Mineville, local architect, who spearheaded the introduction of outrigger racing to California last month, said \$1,400 of the \$3,000 necessary to bring a California crew here, has been pledged.

Mineville, who originated the idea of sending a Hawaiian crew to Newport to compete against the Californians, said he's been notified that in addition to the Mainland crew, several residents and

members of the press will make the jaunt to Hawaii.

"The Newport Dunes community," Mineville said, "has established the Newport Harbor Outrigger Canoe Association, with Norman Durkin as president.

Hawaii won the first outrigger Mainland race, from Catalina Island to Newport Dunes, September 20.

• The ninth annual Molokai-Oahu race will kick off Aloha Week.

Nine Hawaii crews, in addition to the Californians, are slated to start at dawn from Kawakiu Beach, Molokai. The race ends at Duke Kahanamoku Beach.
