Makaha Surfing Meet Nov. 21-22

The seventh annual Makaha International Surfing championships, sponsored by the Waikiki Surf Club, will be held Nov. 21-22 and 28-29 at Makaha Beach in the Waianae district.

Clarence (Mac) Maki has been named general chairman of this year's events with John W. Lind as assistant chairman. Lind, who served as general chairman of the Makaha events several years, is president of the sponsoring club.

PRELIMINARY HEATS in all events will be run on the first two days. Also planned for the night of Nov. 21 is mat and body surfing.

Finals in the four major events (senior and junior men's surfboard riding, women's surfboard riding, and mixed tandem) will be held Nov. 28-29.

Five surfboard paddle events will be held if the surf is not running high on any of the scheduled dates.

Deadline for entries is Nov. 14. Entry blanks may be picked up at the Outrigger Canoe Club, Diamond Head Beach Services, Waikiki Surf

Club and from Ken Nakano at Nakatani Store in Nanakuli.

Maki expects entries from Lima, Peru, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, California and Maui.

Named to reign over the 1959 championships as Miss Makaha Surf is Lorene Perrin, 20-year-old University of Hawaii music education major.

Miss Perrin was runnerup in the 1959 Ka Palapala beauty pageant in the cosmopolitan division.

Maki announced there will be several changes in the surfing rules this year and the changes will be announced shortly.
