

Cole, Canha Qualify For Surf Meet Finals

Depending champion Peter Cole and 1956 winner Conrad Canha both qualified for the finals of the International Surfing Championships yesterday at Makaha Beach.

They were among 10 qualifiers to gain the finals in the Men's Senior event. Cole, Punahou School teacher from California, was in the first heat and Canha participated in the second heat.

Waves ran from 8 to 9 feet and crowds estimated at 3,000 throughout the day watched the semifinals of the men's events and the finals of the women's division.

CLARENCE (MAC) MAKI, general chairman of the meet, announced that judges will announce the results of the women's event today. They had not completed the scoring and reviewing of points last night.

Finals today will be run off in this order: Men Junior, Mixed Tandem and Men Senior. Lorene Perrin will be crowned Makaha Surf Queen around 1 p.m. and she will make the presentation of trophies to winners when the meet is completed.
