

Isle Surfers To Vie In Peru Championship

Six surfers from Hawaii will participate in the International Surfing Meet in Lima, Peru, this month. The meet, sponsored by Club Waikiki of Peru, is scheduled to start Feb. 24.

George Downing and Bob Cloutiers of Waikiki Surf Club, Fred Hemmings and Paul Strauch Jr. of the Duke Kahanamoku Surf Club, Butch Hemmings of Outrigger Canoe Club and Charley Galento of Greg Noll Surf Club are scheduled to compete in the Peru championship.

Felipe Pomar of Peru, a student at Church College of Hawaii in Laie, will also compete in the championships.

Downing and Cloutier were invited to participate in the meet by Club Waikiki. They plan to leave around Feb. 18. The others are being sponsored by the organizations they will represent in the meet.

This will mark Downing's third competition in Peru. He won the Peruvian championship in 1954. Last year he competed in the World Championships at Peru, along with Cloutier, Hemmings and Richard (Buffalo) Keaulana.

Downing is the 1965 Makena International senior surfing champion. Cloutier placed in the finals of this meet the past two years and

was runnerup in the recent Haleiwa meet. He also won the Diamond Head stock-board paddling championship in 1964.

Club Waikiki of Peru has

also invited Bernard Farrelly of Australia, Rusty Miller and Skip Frue of California and outstanding surfers from Brazil, South Africa, Panama and Puerto Rico.

Mantle Leaves Hospital

ROCHESTER, Minn. (UPI) — New York Yankees slugger Mickey Mantle was released from St. Mary's Hospital yesterday after undergoing surgery for the removal of a bone chip from his right shoulder.

A Mayo Clinic spokesman said the \$100,000 a year outfielder would remain here as a clinic out-patient for several weeks to undergo therapy.

He entered the clinic Jan. 17 for examination of the shoulder which began bothering him last season. He said at the time he tried to rest it over the winter but that did not help.

Mike Farrell and Herbert Kaufman gained the men's singles finals. Farrell defeated James Schwitter 6-4, 11-9 in a match that lasted 2 hr. 30 min. while Kaufman disposed of Dooley Kam 5-7, 6-4, 6-3.

Miss Leong was the defending champion and top-seeded entry in women's singles. She won the first set convincingly and led 3-0 in the third set when Mrs. Osborne rallied to triumph. Mrs. Osborne held the title in 1958, 1959 and 1962.
