

OCC wins senior men's canoe race

Outrigger Canoe Club won the feature men's three-mile open race in the annual Walter MacFarlane Memorial Canoe Regatta off Waikiki Beach yesterday.

Waikiki Surf Club finished far ahead of the field in the headline event but was disqualified when the pacesetting craft knocked the flag marker down on the second

turn of the race.

Kauai finished second and Lanikai third.

In the women's top race, the one-mile senior event, Waikiki Surf took first with Heilani second and Kailua third.

W.S.C. and Lanikai finished in a deadlock for team point honors in the 13-event program.

An estimated crowd of 10,000 watched the Outrigger Canoe Club sponsored races.

Next canoe racing event will be the Oahu championships and they'll take place Sunday, July 17, at the Kaneohe Marine Air Station.

Yesterday's program was dedicated to the memory of John D. Kaupiko, who died two years ago. Mr. Kaupiko was long prominent in canoe racing activities here.

The University of Hawaii gained a shot at the Hawaii Baseball League playoffs yesterday, defeating the Red Sox, 6-3, in the final game of the regular season.

That result tied the Rainbows with the Red Sox for fourth place in the standings. They will have a show-down game for the last spot in the Governor's Cup playoffs Thursday night at Hickam Field.

In other games yesterday, the Air Force scored five times in the second inning and held off SubPac, 5-3, and the Braves nipped last-place Pearl Harbor, 2-0, with two runs in the eighth inning.

Dennis Tsuhako pitched a three-hitter for the University against the Red Sox and struck out seven. Mike Umamoto got three hits for the winners, driving in two runs, and Wayne Toku also chipped in with three hits.

Ron Komine's three-run triple was the key blow in the Air Force's five-run second inning against SubPac.

Tom McKenzie pitched the shutout for the Braves, giving Pearl Harbor eight hits and no walks and striking out six. The Braves scored the game's two runs in the eighth against Mike Campbell when Ben Lovell reached base on an error, Ben Almedova rapped a run-scoring double, and Steven Morse followed with a single.

The Governor's Cup playoffs open July 12 at Hickam with regular season champion Asahi meeting third-place Air Force in the first game of the double-elimination tournament. SubPac plays the inner of the University-Red Sox game July 13.
