Outrigger Paddlers Win

The first annual Lanikai-to-Waikiki 23-mile canoe race was won by Outrigger Canoe Club No. 1 team yesterday. The race was in honor of the late Duke Kahanamoku, and held on his birthday.

Outrigger led all the way in choppy seas. Spectators lined the beaches and look-out points to view the event. Ten canoes raced.

The sponsoring Lanikai Canoe Club passed two ca-

noes at Koko Head to finish second. Outrigger was timed in 3 hours, 44 minutes, 8 seconds; Lanikai in 3:47.32.

Waikiki Surf Club No. 2 was third in 3:52 flat, Outrigger No. 2 was fourth in 3:58

flat, Waikiki Surf Club No. 1 was fifth, Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club No. 2 was sixth and Leeward Kai Canoe Club was seventh.

Three boats swamped and did not finish: Lanikai No. 2, Hea Lani and Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club No. 1.

The race started at 8:40 a.m. at Lanikai Point, with team members racing to their canoes and pushing off.

Outrigger No. 1 was off fast and was strong all the way. Paddlers were Jeff Every, Henry Ayau, Mark Buck, Tom Connors, Jody D'Enbeau, Bill Eggers, Mike Holmes, Loch Ledford and Billy Mitchell.

HOUSTON (UPI) — Chicago Cub pitcher Phil Regan yesterday denied he was carrying a tube of vaseline and two slippery elm tablets in his warmup jacket during last Sunday's game against the Cincinnati Reds.

Cincinnati manager Dave Bristol had accused Regan of throwing a "vaseline" ball in that game, and the accusation was carried to the office of National League president Warren Giles.

Giles cleared Regan of any

Bristol said on Thursday, however, that Cincinnati pitcher George Culver found the vaseline tube and the two tablets near home plate as he walked back to the Cincinnati dugout after striking out.
