A tournament to decide the best men's and women's volleyball team in Hawaii will be held today and tomorrow as the USVBA Hawaii Region volleyball open championships take place at Klum Gym.

Pac-8 golf meet revived

WESTLAKE VILLAGE, Calif. (UPI) — The Pacific-8 golf championships have been revived and they'll be held at North Ranch Country Club Monday and Tuesday.

The last Pac-8 golf tournament was held at Eugene, Ore., in 1975 and was won by USC. In 1976 and 1977, the conference tournament was split into Southern and Northern division events.

USC, which will host next week's Pac-8 tourney, has won 10 of the last 14 conference titles and will be favored in the 72-hole event over the 6,828-yard, par 72 layout.

Oregon, UCLA and Stanford are considered contenders.

Hawaii tennis entries closing

Entries will close tomorrow at 5 p.m. for the Hawaii Sectional tennis championship.

Play for the tournament will begin May 6 at the Keehi Lagoon and Ala Moana tennis courts. The winner of the men and women singles play will receive an all-expenses paid trip to South Carolina to participate in a championship tournament, which will be represented by all districts.

The finals of the Hawaii tourney will be held May 13 at the Diamond Head tennis courts.

There are close to 40 men and women teams involved in the two-day playoff, which will begin today for the girls at 6:30 p.m. The men's division will start play at 8:30 a.m. tomorrow and the championship matches for both will be held tomorrow.

The winner and runner-ups in each division will be eligible to represent Hawaii in the USVBA National Championships in El Paso, Tex. on May 16-20.

The favorites in the men's division will be defending champions Outigger Canoe Club.

The Outrigger, winner of the Region 5 open championship held two weeks ago, is coached by University of Hawaii volleyball coach Dave Shoji, and led by USVBA All-Americans Charley Jenkins and Randy Shaw.

The favorites also boast Jim Iams, the Punahou volleyball coach; Kai-noa Downing, a member of one of UCLA's national championship teams; Mike Griffith, a former USC player, and Ilmar Tarikas.

Outrigger's main worries will come from Hilo's Oly Gold team led by Bobby Campbell and Jim Evans; Media 5, Chuck's Cellar, Central YMCA and Parker Broiler from Hilo.

The top team in the women's division will be Nick's Fishmarket I, a team with a strong flavor of UH Wahine players.

Not only is their coach a UH volleyball assistant — Alan Kang — but probably the entire team is composed of wahine players.

Leading Nick's team will be stand-outs Joyce Kapuaala, Waynette Mitchell, Terry Malterre, Roxanne Elias, Anne Goldenson, Bonnie Gouveia, Paula Gusman — all UH players — and Kamehameha stand-out bound for Manoa, Nahaku Brown.

Challenging Nick's I will be Ho'o Ikaika, which is led by former UH star Joey Akeo; Nick's II, composed of the other half of the UH wahine team, Cathy Hollinger, Laurel Clay, Mary Ann Singleton and Nancy Renner, and the Haili Women's Volleyball Club.
