HEALANI JUMPED to an early regatta lead, winning four of the first six events. But at the halfway mark, it was Waikiki Surf Club in first place with 32 points, followed by Outrigger with 27 and Healani with 22.

"As for OCC's success, consistency is key," said Norfleet. "We only won four of the 24 events but we almost always seem to rack up points by placing second or third. At OCC, we have an enthusiastic program which offers good depth."

A crew of six veteran Waikiki Surf Club paddlers won the new 50-year-
