

PINE MOUNTAIN, Ga. — Hawaii's globetrotting — and conquering — junior golfers settled for a fourth and a seventh place in the third annual PGA National Junior Golf Championships yesterday at Callaway Gardens.

Mitchell Murata finished in a tie for fourth among the boys while Lori Castillo, who won the USGA Junior Amateur 17-and-under title a week ago, finished seventh in the girls division, carding a 78 for a total 318.

Murata finished with par 75 for a total 295, good enough for a fourth place tie with Scott Myers of Louisiana and a berth on the U. S. Junior PGA Match Team that goes to Caracas, Venezuela, Sept. 18-23.

Murata finished six strokes back of Arizona's Willie Wood who had a closing one-over-par 76 for a 289.

Wood held off a late charge by Bob Wolcott of Tennessee and sank a clutch birdie putt on the fourth extra hole to win the third championship.

The 17-year-old Tucson native sank an eight-foot putt to end Wolcott's final round charge. Wolcott, who had started the day three strokes back, made that up in the last round before losing in sudden death.

At the beginning of yesterday's round Wood was two ahead of Monty Leong of San Diego, who ended up third with a 292 total.

In the girls' division Kathy Baker of Clover, S.C., struggled to a closing round 80 but won by three strokes over Sharon Barrett of Green Valley, Calif. Baker had an 8-over-par 304, while Barrett finished with a final round 75 for a 307 total.

### *Hui Nalu wins regatta*

Hui Nalu led from the start yesterday in winning the Duke Kahana-moku Regatta, a 22-mile race from Lanikai to Waikiki.

Hui Nalu's No. 63 canoe finished

nearly five minutes ahead of its nearest rival, Waikiki Surf, 3:24.15 to 3:29.00.

The Waikiki Beachboys, the only team finishing in the top 10 to use just one six-man crew, finished third at 3:30.

Waikiki Surf, Outrigger and Lanikai were the only koa finishers in the top 10.
