## Minvielle Named Grand Marshal

A.E. "Toots" Minvielle Jr., a Hawaii resident who started outrigger canoe paddling with the Outrigger Canoe Club in 1917, has been named grand marshal for the Coors U.S. Outrigger Canoe Championships, Aug. 27-28, between Newport Beach, Calif., and Catalina Island.

Minvielle helped organize two of the top races in

the sport, the Molokai-to-Oahu race in 1952 and the Balboa-to-Catalina race in 1959. Also, at the age of 76, he took an outrigger crew to England and paddled across the English Channel from Calais, France, to Dover, England, in four hours, 11 minutes.
