NOTE: In the present rules, the words "will" or "may" wherever they appear are changed to "shall" unless the context clearly indicates that the present wording is intended.

I. EVENTS (No proposed changes)

II. CLASSIFICATION

H. Novice: Change last sentence to read:
"Except for sanctioned races held in the surf, all first place winners in this classification shall no longer be eligible to paddle in a novice crew after the close of the season."

V. EQUIPMENT (Continued)

C. CLUB FLAGS

Delete this subsection and re-letter the following subsection to:

C. MISCELLANEOUS

- 1. Change the word "may" in first line to word "shall".
- 2. Change the word "will" to word "shall".

VI. OFFICIALS

A. RACE COMMITTEE OFFICIALS

- 3. This entire subsection contains confusing typographical errors going back to the race rules of 1964. A complete re-draft will be submitted at the convention.

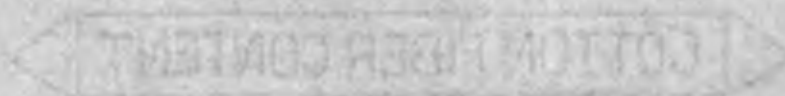
VII. DRAWING OF LANES

Re-title and reorganize to more orderly sequence and provide for selection of lanes by each club in the order as determined by lot, as follows:

VII. RECEIPT OF ENTRIES AND DRAWING OF LANES

A. DATE

The race committee shall designate the place and set the time and date for the receipt of entries and drawing of lanes, which shall be not later than seven (7) days prior to a regatta. A club which is unable to attend the drawing at the time and date set may submit its entries together with the required entry fees to the race committee at an earlier date.



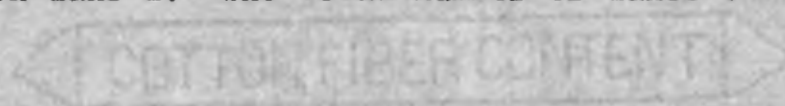
VII. RECEIPT OF ENTRIES AND DRAWING OF LANES (Continued)

B. ENTRIES

1. An original entry list for a crew shall include the names of at least six (6) and no more than twelve (12) eligible paddlers. The names on an entry list shall at all times correspond with the names on the club roster, which shall be kept current, particularly as to married names of women paddlers.
2. Each club shall be limited to one (1) entry per event.
3. Each entry must be accompanied by the prescribed entry fee unless pre-payment has been made with the race committee or the treasurer. If a club has a credit balance with the treasurer to cover the entry fee for any race, the race committee shall be so notified by the treasurer prior to lane drawing.
4. There shall be no post entries or substitutions of names on entry lists after the drawing of lanes.
5. The final entry list shall be submitted on the date of the regatta prior to each race upon the call of the race officials. This entry list shall contain only six (6) names, and these names shall have appeared on the original entry list. The persons who actually paddle the race shall be those whose names appear on the final entry list.

C. LANE DRAWING

1. The drawing of lanes shall take place after the receipt of entries for all events.
2. Only clubs who have made proper entry and paid the entry fee shall be permitted to draw lanes for any particular race. The race committee chairman shall appoint a person to draw lanes for any club properly entered but unable to be represented at the drawing.
3. The lanes to be used shall be consecutive and commence with lane 1. The total number of lanes shall equal the



VII. RECEIPT OF ENTRIES AND DRAWING OF LANES (Continued)

C. LANE DRAWING

- 3. number of entries. Lane 1 shall be the shoreward lane (for courses parallel to shore) and the left hand lane looking seaward (for courses running generally perpendicular to shore).
- 4. The selection of lanes shall be by the various clubs in the order as determined by drawing of lots. Clubs whose lanes are selected by an appointee of the race committee chairman shall abide by the lane selection made by said appointee.

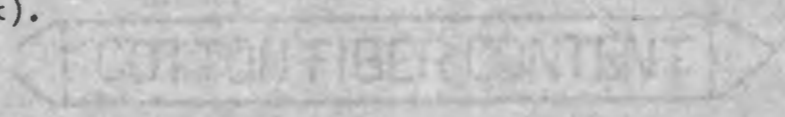
VIII. FLAT COURSE RULES

B. STARTING

- 2. Recall. (Revise to read)

A start shall be recalled in the following manner: The starter shall (a) fire two or more rounds; and (b) cause a special recall flag to be raised on the judges' stand. Canoes unable to hear the recall shall be stopped as soon as possible by the committee boat. A start shall be recalled for: (a) an unfair start, in which case the recall must be instigated by the starter himself and not by a canoe crew; (b) swamping or capsizing of a canoe within the first ten (10) seconds after the start; and (c) breakage of equipment within the first ten (10) seconds after the start. Breakage of equipment must be signaled within the ten (10) second period by raising and waving a paddle by any crew member. It shall be the duty of the inspector to check all recalls for breakage and report his findings to the Race Chairman before a race shall be re-started. Any crew causing an illegal recall shall be automatically disqualified.

- 4. (Revise first sentence to read:) Failure to follow the starter's instructions such as deliberately paddling contrary to the starter's instructions or crossing the starting line before the starting signal may be classified as a false start. (2nd sentence ok).



III. ELIGIBILITY

C. ENTRANCE FEES

- 2. Change the word "by-laws" in the first sentence to the words "race rules."
Change the word "may" in the second sentence and word "will" in the third sentence to the word "shall."
- 3. Change the word "will" in the first line to the word "shall."

IV. REGISTRATION

Correct typographical error by adding title to subsection A, as follows:

- A. Registration Cards: Each member club - - etc. - -

V. EQUIPMENT

A. CANOE SPECIFICATIONS

Combine and reword subsections 1 and 4 and retain as subsection 1, as follows:

- 1. The hull of the canoe shall be hollowed out of a solid koa log. The canoe shall weight not less than 400 pounds. For the purpose of weight determination the word "canoe" shall not include ama, iakos, and tying cord, but shall include hull and permanent fixtures such as manu, gunwales, wae, seats, ribs, patches, fiberglass, and lead weights required to bring the total canoe weight to at least 400 pounds. Lead weights shall be permanently affixed by means of metal screws to the canoe at such location, or locations, to allow for ease of inspection by the race officials at any time during the course of a regatta.

VIII. FLAT COURSE RULES (Continued)

C. STALLING

The starter shall not hold up the start for a canoe deliberately lagging behind after the starter's command to get on the starting line. A lagging canoe shall have no right of protest on the grounds of an unfair start in the event the race is started, however a lagging canoe shall not be deprived of a recall for swamping, capsizing or equipment breakage.

C. LANES (Revise first sentence and first word of second sentence)

1. All canoes must remain in their own lanes while passing the lane flags, which shall be to the left of the canoe. Canoes shall keep - - - etc. - - -
2. If a club should scratch from a race in which it has been entered, the resulting empty lane shall be offered to and may be used by the crew originally assigned to the adjoining lane seaward of the empty lane; and if that second crew declines, then the empty lane shall be offered to the crew in the next adjacent lane seaward. If that third crew should accept, then the empty lane thus created shall be treated in the foregoing manner and repeated in the same manner to the furthest lane seaward.

XII. PROTESTS

- A. In the third sentence change period to coma and add the following:
 "and the regatta shall be temporarily suspended."
 In the fourth sentence, replace the words "acting upon" with the following:
 "hearing and apprising itself of the facts surrounding."
 After the fourth sentence, insert the following two sentences:
 "After the hearing has been completed, the Race Committee shall exclude all persons and immediately deliberate and render its decision. As soon as the decision has been announced, the regatta shall be resumed.

Mr. Mann requested a draft or transcriptions of the Kauai minutes relative to the Race Rules so that he can bring the proposed Race Rules for the next meeting.


INSURANCE: Mr. Otremba announced that the liability insurance is due on April 10, 1968. Deferred to next meeting

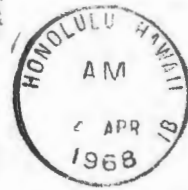



COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- a. Race Committee: In the absence of Mr. Kapua, Race Chairman, the President read the following report:

1. Drawing of lanes for K-Bay race will be held on June 5 at 5:00 P.M. at the Ala Wai Clubhouse. Bring 3 copies of crew rosters for the race.
2. The Kamehameha Day Race will start promptly at 10:00 A.M. on Sunday, June 9, 1968 at the Kalama Side of Kailua Park. 8:00 A.M. weighing of canoes with Outrigger furnishing the scales. 9:30 meeting of all coaches and steersmen only.
3. Kailua HCC will lay the lanes for the races and furnish two official boats.
4. Expenses for the races:

State Championship Race: Mr. Kapua and Mr. Faria will negotiate with officials of the Kaneohe Marine Air Station for the use of K-Bay as the racing site.

- b. Ways and Means: Mr. Rodenhurst reported that this committee met to discuss ways of raising money for the Association. It was decided to print a program by selling ads in the program. The program would give the history of HCRA, club pictures as well as the racing schedule for the day. If the required number of ads are sold the Association could realize an amount of \$600 after expenses. The Committee is not asking the clubs to sell ads unless they know of anyone who would be interested. However, the clubs are being asked to sell this program for 25¢ each. If all 2000 copies are sold, we could realize another \$500, making a total of \$1100 to the Association.

Twelve letters with contracts were mailed out to advertising agencies but as yet no replies have been received. Mr. Otremba reported that he already sold the back cover for \$200; the inside back cover for \$175; and the inside front cover for \$175.

RACE RULES: Mr. Mann reported that the race rules were printed and distributed, but in the meantime, the error that was made in the race rules which was typed back in 1964 under Article VI, Section A, subsection 3, was found and therefore the Secretary will make the correction and redistribute the page (5).

Mr. Mann suggested that each club make note of areas where improvement can be made at each race to be presented to the Race Committee so that these improvements could be incorporated in the Race Rules for next year.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Mr. Bent reported that in checking the eligibility of the Kai Opua Club of Kona, Hawaii, he found that they had paid their dues but somehow the check was misplaced. He confirmed that they (Kai Opua) are members of the Association.

Mr. Aiu said he had written to Kai Opua (Mr. Kauwe, President) about this lost check but to date has had no reply. He suggested that if they had not received the cancelled check that they reissue another check.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Mann renewed the invitation of the Outrigger Invitational Race on the 4th of July. The race will be at 10:00 A.M. at Waikiki Beach in front of the Moana Hotel. The invitation is extended to six clubs only in each event to be determined by their performance at the K-Bay Race. He said the clubs finishing in 7th and 8th places may prepare to race in the event of scratches or if any of the other clubs would pull out. There will be 6 boats in each race.

Any club who plans to scratch should let the Race Committee know the night before the race.

Mr. Mann stated that in the event any of the neighbor island clubs would want to participate in the July 4th race, their requests would be honored and the Oahu clubs' participation would be reduced.

The Secretary was directed to write to the Kauai and Molokai Clubs to ask if they wished to participate and they should reply by June 27 if they are interested in entering the race.

Approval was given to the Outrigger Club to sponsor this Invitation race.

The President asked permission of the Board to purchase the material for the flags at \$50.00.

MOTION: It was moved by Mr. Kauhane seconded by Mr. Rodenhurst to purchase the material at the appropriate time and sew the flags for the amount of \$50.00.

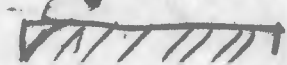

R E S O L U T I O N N O . 1

RELATING TO SECTION 4 OF ARTICLE IV OF THE BY-LAWS OF THE HAWAIIAN CANOE RACING ASSOCIATION, AS AMENDED.

SECTION 1. Section 4 of Article IV of the By-Laws, of the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Section 4. (1) At the beginning of every calendar year, each member club shall submit to the secretary of this association, in writing, their selection of one director and two alternates, as official representatives of said member club, and with the authority to participate and vote on all matters before the association. Said letter to be signed by either the President or Secretary of said such change or substitution or director or alternates.

(2) No director or alternate representing one club may serve as a director or alternate of another club.

SECTION 2. These amendments shall take effect upon it's approval.

The following amendments were made to Section 4 - (a) by adding "AS OFFICIAL REPRESENTATIVES OF SAID MEMBER CLUB, AND WITH THE AUTHORITY TO PARTICIPATE AND VOTE ON ALL MATTERS BEFORE THE ASSOCIATION"; (b) by adding "PRESIDENT OR" BEFORE SECRETARY" and (c) by deleting "AND/OR PRESIDING OFFICER".

R E S O L U T I O N N O. 2

AMENDING SECTION 2 AND SECTION 6 OF ARTICLE IV OF THE BY-LAWS OF THE HAWAIIAN CANOE RACING ASSOCIATION, AS AMENDED.

SECTION 1. Section 2 of Article IV of the By-Laws of the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. The Board of Directors shall be comprised of one (1) Director and two (2) alternates from each of the member clubs, the immediate past president, honorary directors, and shall include other persons who are not members of a club, to be elected by a 3/4 vote by the Board, as Directors-at-Large with a vote. All past presidents, except the immediate past president, shall be known as honorary directors. The immediate past president shall be an ex-officio member of the Board, with the right to vote."

"Section 6. Each member club, officer and Director-at-Large and the immediate past president, shall, at all times and on all questions, be entitled to one (1) vote, providing that said persons are present."

SECTION 2. These amendments shall take effect upon it's approval.

The following amendments were made to: (a) Section 2 - by adding - "EXCEPT THE IMMEDIATE PAST PRESIDENT" and "WITH THE RIGHT TO VOTE" and deleting "VOTING ONLY IN CASE OF A TIE"; and (b) Section 6 - by deleting "HONORARY DIRECTORS SHALL SERVE WITHOUT VOTE".

RESOLUTION NO. 3

AMENDING ARTICLE V OF THE BY-LAWS OF THE HAWAIIAN CANOE RACING ASSOCIATION, AS AMENDED.

SECTION 1. Article V of the By-Laws of the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:

"By deleting Section 3, which presently reads as follows:

Section 3. This amendment shall become effective upon its approval. (Amended 1-13-68)

SECTION 2. This amendment shall become effective upon its approval.

The amendment proposed is a matter of style. It is not necessary to include the present language of Section 3, as an adopted amendment. SECTION 1. Article VIII of the By-Laws of the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VIII

STANDING AND SPECIAL COMMITTEES
AND APPOINTMENTS

Section 1. Standing Committees. There shall be the following standing committees:

- (a) Race
- (b) Finance
- (c) Ways and Means
- (d) Discipline
- (e) Publicity
- (f) Awards

Section 2. Each standing committee shall be composed of at least three (3) and not more than five (5) members, and shall serve for a term of one year, commencing on the first day of January of each year. All committeemen shall be appointed by the president, with the approval of the Board of Directors and they shall perform such duties as may be herein defined or later directed.

Section 3. Special Committees may be appointed, under the same provisions contained in the manner prescribed herein, except that their term of service may be limited to the time required to execute their mission.

Section 4. The president may appoint, with the approval of Board, an Executive Secretary, who shall serve until replaced.

SECTION 2. This amendment shall take effect upon its approval. Amendments proposed are as follows: (a) by deleting - "EXECUTIVE SECRETARY" from Section 1, Executive Secretary as presently constituted is not considered a Standing Committee; (b) By adding "AT LEAST THREE AND NOT MORE THAN FIVE MEMBERS" in lieu of the present - "three or more members"; and (c) By substituting the word "MAY" for "SHALL" in Section 4.

R E S O L U T I O N N O . 10

AMENDING SECTION 5 OF ARTICLE XIV OF THE BY-LAWS OF THE HAWAIIAN CANOE RACING ASSOCIATION, AS AMENDED.

SECTION 1. Section 5 of the By-Laws of the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Section 5. Any alleged violation of the By-Laws, the Rules of Conduct or the Race Rules, of this association shall render a club subject to disciplinary action at the discretion of the Board. In such cases, the club involved shall be given at least one (1) week's notice in writing, of the charges pending against the said club."

SECTION 2. This amendment shall take effect upon its approval.

Section 5 was amended as follows: (a) By inserting the word "ALLEGED" before violation; (b) by deleting "WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE" and inserting the words "OR THE"; (c) By deleting the words "OF THIS ASSOCIATION OR ITS" appearing on the first line, and by adding a comma (,) after By-Laws; (d) By inserting the word "THE" before Rules of Conduct; (e) By inserting the words "OR THE" after the word Conduct; and (f) By adding the words "OF THIS ASSOCIATION" after the comma, following the words "Race Rules", (g) the words "THE SAID CLUB" substituted for the word "IT" following the words "PENDING AGAINST".
